### DLP Annual Conference 2015

The Developmental Leadership Program (DLP) is inviting both academics and practitioners to propose conference papers for their annual conference on “The Politics of Inequality”, which will take place at the University of Birmingham. The conference will showcase papers that address how politics creates or maintains inequalities, and discuss which inequalities and why. Who are the actors, what are the social structures involved? How do power, norms and ideas sustain inequalities? What is the role of leadership in perpetuating or alleviating inequalities? Empirical research and case studies are particularly welcome.

The deadline for proposals of no more than 300 words is Monday, 1 December 2014.
