# Racism protests... the abstract structure of public opinion in the USA

"When the looting starts, the shooting starts", tweeted Donald Trump. But what do USA citizens think? Shortly after the police killing of George Floyd a Reuters/Ipsos survey reported that a majority of Americans support peaceful protest but not violence and are dissatisfied with Trump's response. In an indepth analysis of the survey by Gordon Burt an underlying distribution is

inferred from the surface percentages. Diversity within the population, and within and between Republican and Democrat subgroups; gaps and overlaps between subgroups; consensus and disagreement; and polarisation are studied.
